The 2014 season was another fantastic year for all involved with the Northern Suburbs Football Association. The New Year brought new premises in Pymble for our head office, providing a more central base. I was also excited by the addition of another synthetic field in our district with Charles Bean (UTS) being used for the entire year from pre-season to hosting Champions of Champions matches.

Ground development is a very important part of growing the game in our area with limited use on grounds, as seen with a few washouts this year. With Charles Bean, Northbridge and now Blackman, Chatswood and Cammeray coming in 2015, the Association is increasing the number of high quality fields for all our players.

Along with the synthetic pitches we also saw floodlight upgrades at Berowra Oval. A big thank you to Matt Kean Hornsby MP for his assistance in funding the upgrade. This allowed additional night matches including the Northern Premier League derby which was a massive success. I look forward to developing more grounds to improve the quality and amount of football that can be played.

In 2014 on the field we saw Willoughby Dalleys win their first Premier League title; congratulations to Willoughby Dalleys and to North Sydney for winning the Women's Competition. The NSFA Cup was won by Kissing Point for the 7th time in a classic match played in wet weather and came down to the last 2 minutes for the winner to be scored.

I am very proud of the progress of the Northern Tigers as we continue to see great quality results and player development from grassroots to the Premier league Competitions.

It is with great sadness I acknowledge the passing of Gil Merlo this year and would like to acknowledge the great amount of effort he put into football for the Lindfield Football Club and the Association in general. Also during the past year, two of our Life Members passed away, Lew Thomas and Jim Flint

In closing I would like to thank all volunteers that contribute to our association, whether they are committee members, coaches, managers, Canteen operators. Volunteers are a key component to ensuring our ongoing success.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

The Association achieved some major milestones in 2014. More people played in our winter competitions than ever before, NSFA's Member Clubs commenced their involvement in the National Club Accreditation System, we launched the NSFA Strategic Facilities Plan, relocated our office from Asquith to a more central Pymble location, strengthened our online and social media presence and communications capabilities, and rejuvenated our Strategic Plan to take us through to 2016. While it hasn't always been easy (or dry!), 2014 is a year that the Association and its members can be proud of.

In the main NSFA winter competitions, we had a total of 15,868 registered players. This is an increase of 589 players – a growth of almost 4% from last season. Pleasingly, much of the growth was in junior football, with girls' MiniRoos in particular showing a strong increase in players. These statistics suggest that we are successfully attracting young children to the game. The hope is that with the Asian Cup on home soil in January 2015 this trend will continue as more and more people come to realise what the world of football can offer.

One particular initiative which will add to the player base in 2015 is the introduction of football programs for children who are not yet at school. In response to an NSFA survey, over 83% of respondents stated that the introduction of an Under 5 program was a good idea – particularly as there are so many unaccredited providers already operating programs in this space.

NSFA is working closely with FFA to run pilot programs over the coming summer which incorporate FFA teaching materials. We should then be ready to kick off "MiniRoos KickStart" formally in Term 2, 2015.

The quality of grounds we play on probably remains the biggest area of concern for our members. In appreciation of this fact, NSFA has devoted significant time to the development of the Strategic Facilities Plan, which was launched earlier this year. This document has already been the catalyst to discussions with the Mayors and General Managers of the five NSFA Councils we work with and Football NSW is now using the document as a precedent for other Associations to follow. The most important project currently underway is the North Turramurra Recreation Area; NSFA is currently working closely with Ku-ring-gai Council on the proposed football facilities and our shared goal is that we will be able to play football there at some stage in 2016.

Another area where NSFA has sought to make progress is in its communications with individual players and parents. The NSFA website received a makeover this year. We believe that the new site will provide a better platform for the functionality which will be needed in coming years and it looks great too! We have also instituted the NSFA newsletter which goes out to all members weekly during the season – already the open rates and click rates for this newsletter are ahead of industry standard.

Finally, we have launched official presences for the Association on both Facebook and Twitter, both of which will continue to gain importance in 2015. Effective communication with our community is something that we know we must continue to improve, to build on the giant strides taken in this area in 2014.

The other area which I would like to address at this time is the participation of the Association in the National Club Accreditation System, FFA's program to improve the administration of grassroots clubs. NSFA is the only Association in New South Wales which has mandated participation in this system, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Member Clubs for willingly joining this journey. The feedback we have received is that the process has prompted Committees to stop and think about the framework of their Club and what they can do to make their systems and policies better for future seasons. I strongly believe that the biggest value add which NSFA can provide is in helping build stronger and better individual Clubs.

On the other side of the ledger, 2014 has also brought some lowlights. Principally amongst these were the cancellation due to weather of all of the Gala Days as well as the inaugural Under 6 Welcome to Football Day. It's ironic that in a year marked by a bone-dry winter, rain has robbed us of the biggest days on the community football calendar. Better luck next year! While there's nothing we can do about the rain, there have also been disappointments at the business level. From my perspective the inability to get a paperless match card system trialled and tested in time for 2015 represents the biggest failure. While trials were carried out towards the end of the 2014 winter season, unfortunately these were insufficient for the business to move to a completely paperless system for next year. Accordingly, we will be spending the first half of 2015 making sure that this paperless solution can be rolled out as soon as possible.

Overall though, the past twelve months have been successful for the Association. Northern Tigers continues to be a model representative Club, both on and off the field, while 2014 saw the launch of both the Under 11 Diamond League for girls as well as the NSFA Regional Youth League program for boys aged U12-U15. On the coaching side, more people have undertaken coaching courses through the Association than ever before. Under the supervision of the Association's Technical Director these pathways for both players and coaches continue to be strengthened.

Importantly, the Association will be reporting another strong financial performance this year; not only will we meet budget expectations but we will exceed them. This result is vital not only because it allows the Association to invest operating surpluses into facilities projects, but also because it is a signal to Member Clubs that your Association is managing your funds appropriately. As has historically been the case, the audited financial results will be available online for review in due course.

On behalf of the Association, I would like to thank all of those who have contributed to the past financial year in one way or another. In particular my thanks goes to those who have volunteered their time, whether on Club Committees, coaching teams, being part of NSFA Competition Committees, refereeing games or even being Directors of the Association itself. Finally, on a personal note, I would like to thank the NSFA staff, whose hard work and (largely) good cheer remain somewhat underappreciated, but certainly not by the Directors or myself.

JUNIOR MIXED FOOTBALL REPORT



The 2014 Season at Northern Suburbs Football Association saw a record number of 9,640 Junior Mixed players, an increase of 6% on previous years. In particular, we had record numbers in U7, U8, U10, U11, U12, U13, U14 and U15 Age groups.

Unfortunately, the season came to an abrupt end with August in Sydney being the wettest since 1908 and cloudiest since 1998. This is the first time Gala Day has been washed out since 1996 and only the second time in 28 years. I would like to recognise the long and diligent work of the NSFA Office, without the super human efforts of Damian Miles, Marcia Allman and Jodi Sparks, we would not be able to enjoy more than 500 Junior Mixed Football matches each and every weekend.

This year it was planned to have our inaugural U6 "Welcome to Football" Fun Day, which unfortunately was washed out. In addition, we had planned holding U12 preseason grading days but the rain closed many grounds during this first week which did not allow a complete result. Here's hoping for a drier season in 2015.

During 2014 Season we trialled playing U18 Division 1 on Friday Nights. Unfortunately, the scheduling of Friday night matches did not retain or increase the number of U18 players as expected.

Football Federation of Australia has been introducing a new brand for non-competition Junior Football called MiniRoos. There is very little difference to the SSF Football we have been playing in NSFA for over 5 years. We will see MiniRoos brand being more prevalent in 2015.

I would like to thank the 2014 Junior Football Committee (JFC) members for their devotion in applying their depth of experience in overseeing non-competition Junior and competition Youth Football of the Association;

MEN'S FOOTBALL REPORT



Firstly I would like to sincerely thank Roy Ashpole for his many years leading the Men's Football Committee ("MFC"). Roy has done much to push forward the competitions. As you will see below he continues to do so as a continuing Committee Member and Division Liaison Officer ("DLO").

I received great support from the committee, NSFA Office, Clubs and Players during my first year as Chair of the MFC. We meet at least monthly during the pre-season and season to ensure that all competitions are well structured. During the season we meet to deal with scheduling matters (mostly rain but can be other matters) and to adjudicate on issues. Most notably in 2014 this included player eligibility and disposition of abandoned matches.

We continue to be stretched on Saturday afternoons for sufficient facilities to play all Men's Competition fixtures. Although the addition of the synthetic surface at Charles Bean significantly assisted with this in 2014 it was still insufficient. As a result we continued our policy of scheduling 3-4 divisions (excluding PL) to play on Sundays each week. We conducted a survey in 2014 to ascertain opinions surrounding the potential move of M45 to a pure Sunday Competition. The survey indicated a strong objection to this proposition.

The MFC discussed in 2014 whether a term of office should be instigated. This would allow for new ideas and approaches to be included in the MFC deliberations whilst giving a well-earned rest to those that have been contributing for a long period. If you would like to consider being an MFC member please do not hesitate to contact me.

Division Structure

It has long been the intention of the MFC to have ten teams/squads in each division. In 2014 we moved in that direction until late withdrawals caused some re-arrangement.

Ten teams works well with our season duration and avoids "byes" in odd numbered divisions. A further desire of the MFC is to have a relatively firm two up / two down promotion and relegation structure. This enables teams / squads to potentially stay in a competitive environment for as long as possible. It also creates a 40% refresh of each division each year which creates freshness in the competition.

Grounds

In 2014 the Men's Competition utilised 59 grounds to schedule 2,080 matches covering Regular Competition, Cup Matches and Friendlies. The heaviest used grounds are contained in the table to the right. As you can see all grounds also have other NSFA Competition played on them. In the case of Charles Bean 181 matches across the NSFA were played there in 2014. This averages to a little over 6 matches per week. On top of this grounds are required for training adding to the usage load.

In 2014 MFC continued to grow the number of matches played in the evening (games commencing at 5pm or later). 50 matches were played in these time slots on a number of evenings. Grounds used for evening matches were Auluba, Berowra, Charles Bean, Mimosa, Northbridge and Primrose.

In 2015 we will have the benefit of the re-opening of Blackman Oval. This oval contains two synthetic surfaces as well as grassed pitches. As Blackman is (similar to Charles Bean) some distance from residential areas we anticipate being able to extend our evening matches.



At the time of writing this report a number of other developments are taking place which will add much needed stock to our facilities. These are Chatswood High School, Anderson Park, North Sydney, Cammeray, Thompson Park in Willoughby and the North Turrumurra Recreation Area in Ku-ring Gai. This development is a multi-field development and is the first new field in a long time.

Referees

Referees are given too hard a time by too many players and officials. A common complaint is that we have insufficient number of referees and those that we do have are of insufficient quality and capability. Although there is always some truth to this statement, I truly believe that Clubs, Managers, Coaches and Players have a part to play in encouraging referees of all ages. I understand that we are passionate about our game and sometimes this boils over into various levels of abuse of the referee from simple dissent to serious abuse. Can I ask all that read this report to consider what they can do to improve the lot of the referee in 2015.

On the statistical front Men's Completions in 2014 had 205 separate centre referees covering 76.6% of matches (2013 – 72.4%). Of those referees 96 officiated for 5 or less matches. The average number of matches officiated by each referee was 8. If we were able to get all referees to increase availability by 2 matches we would have close to 100% centre referee coverage.

Electronic Match Cards

This initiative resulting from the Strategic Planning Workshop at Killara Golf Club was put into pilot mode across 3 divisions towards the end of the season. Unfortunately this co-incided with the end of season deluge. As a result the pilot will continue into 2015 with a full roll out currently planned for 2016.

This is a fantastic initiative and will enable our smart device savvy generation to prepare the match card online without having to remember FFA Ids etc. It also allows the other club to do id checks from the smart device.

It avoids all those undecipherable match cards to be a thing of the past. We are hopeful of full integration with the Referees and also with score reporting.

Champion of Champions

Unfortunately none of our Men's Teams have made it to the Champion of Champions Finals in 2014. West Pymble M45 progressed the furthest.

Willoughby Dalleys (our Premier League Champions) had a first round bye followed by a comfortable defeat of Parklea (BDSFA) in round 2. In the Quarter Finals they were narrowly defeated 1-0 by Kenthurst (GHFA)

Northbridge FC (our M35 Champions) had an exciting 4-3 win over Glenwood Redbacks (BDSFA) in the round of 16 only to come unstuck 2-1 by Sydney Juniors (aptly named for an over 35 competition) in the Quarter Finals.

West Pymble FC (our M45 Champions) defeated Quakers Hill Jnr (BDSFA) 2-1 in the round of 16, followed by a solid 3-0 defeat of Panania RSL (BDAFA) in the Quarter Finals only to be defeted by the odd goal in 5 by Lilli Pilli (SSFA) in the Semi-Final.

Congratulations to all teams representing NSFA in this illustrious tournament.

Also congratulations to our two Girls Teams that have made it to the CofC Finals – Northbridge FC (G12) and Lindfield FC (G16).

In our Association Cup Competitions Kissing Point prevailed over North Sydney in the NSFA Cup to finish the season on a high note for them having also finished runners up in the Premier League. In the Rick Close Cup, West Pymble finished off a great season with a resounding win over Berowra.

In Summary 2014 was a fantastic year, the weather was kind to us (apart from the very end). All Competition Games and Cup Matches were played and some Divisions managed to get a Finals Series in as well. The Competition is growing in both Teams and Player numbers. We look forward to an even more prosperous 2015

GIRL'S/WOMEN'S FOOTBALL REPORT



“Girls who play sport are more likely to attain better grades, be in better health and earn higher wages in the course of their lives” These sentiments expressed by Her Excellency Ms Quentin Bryce are the foundation of my goals for female football within the NSFA.

To construct a competition that caters for all members of the female community is a challenge. Not only do we need to provide these competitions but they need to be an enjoyable situation for differing ages, skill levels, motivation levels and individual/team social requirements.

I firmly believe that increasing skill level of all female players is the key to a better competition, retention of players and most importantly the enjoyment of the players. There is no doubt that football is a skill that needs to be learnt and that opportunity to learn should be available to all female players young, old, new to the game or a seasoned player.

To this end we have in 2014 commenced the Girls football school and holiday clinics. We have continued the Women's football training sessions and through the Diamond League we have created centres for development of girl's football within NSFA. It is impossible for all 34 clubs within our association to provide the quality coaching and facilities required to make this work, so I am very thankful to the management from Northbridge, Lindfield, St Michaels, Hornsby heights, West Pymble and North Turramurra for stepping up and committing to girls/women's football by participating in Diamond League.

The success of the Diamond League is reflected in the numbers of participation in the G11 age group which have increased 169%. As Diamond League progresses into G12 for 2015 we expect to see these numbers solidified and increased in years where there is a traditional drop off because of high school commitments.

I am also a firm believer of the benefits of all female training programmes and girls playing and training with their own gender. This view is supported by numerous studies. This is particularly relevant within the non-comp age groups. The physicality of boys discourages all but the most resilient girls. My aim is to make sure that the majority of girls play with all girl teams in the 2015 season, this will be particularly important within any club wanting to participate in the Diamond League in the following years. This includes G6, G7 and beyond.

Because there are different skill levels and many unknowns within certain teams, as occurs in the WAA and W35, we elected this year for the W35 to create two ten team divisions and then split the competition after a full round. Although this approach had its detractors, it led to a greater variety of opponents and a fairer competition. There is a push from some clubs to introduce a squad system for WAA and W35, this will be further investigated in the following months.

Girls 12s

Division 1 – Northbridge A (*with a convincing win for the season and also won the Champion of Champions and State Cup in 2014*)

Division 2 – Sacred Heart Pymble (*also convincingly winning in a large division*)

Girls 14s

Division 1 – dominated by the Lindfield A and Northbridge A (*with a win by Lindfield only due to a goal difference count back*)

Division 2 – equally tight between Greenwich and Kissing Point (*with a win by Kissing Point due to a goal difference count back*)

Girl's 16s

Division 1 – dominated by the Lindfield A and B teams
(Lindfield made the final in Champion of Champions but they lost to a golden goal in extra time).

6-A-SIDE REPORT



As summer rolls around again it is worth reflecting on the successes and challenges of the 2013/14 6-a-side season.

Overall, last summer has to count as a resounding success, as we provided a fun and competitive environment for summer football with more than 1,500 registrations. NSFA's 6-a-side programs continue to fulfil a number of valuable requirements for the Association:

- A social experience for people of all ages throughout the region
- Off season training for winter football players
- A pathway for young referees through our Assistant 6-a-side Officials (ASO) program
- Involvement in a new game in 6-a-side which has enough variations from 11-a-side to keep experienced winter players on their toes!
- An excellent introduction to the world of football for people who have never played before
- An opportunity to keep fit over the holiday season
- A whole stack of fun in the sun

Our biggest win in the summer of 2013/14 was the introduction of a new competition at Mills Park in Asquith. Under the expert supervision of Marcia Allman and George Karavatakis we kicked off divisions across most age groups with the competition providing access to 6-a-side games to residents in the northern parts of the Association. Last summer was an excellent foundation for this new competition and we hope to grow on that in the coming years.

At St Ives Showground the carnival was back for another year. Around 150 teams participated each week, and at its busiest the Showground had 14 matches running at once.

It is great to see this competition reunite players from the previous year(s) and this competition has definitely become a community all of its own. At the highest levels of the competition, divisions such as the Wednesday Men's All Age Competition in particular continued to produce some very high quality football.

In terms of challenges, the weather remains something that we can't control, however last season also saw air pollution from bushfires added to the list. As a result we have developed a system for determining when air quality becomes too poor to play, involving the Air Quality Rating on the NSW Health website. As always, the safety of participants remains the number one priority. Also, the lighting at the Showground is something we look to improve – at the time of writing we are booked for the next Ku-ring-gai Council cherry-picker to replace some of the blown bulbs.

A big improvement for the coming season involves the new synthetic pitches at Blackman Oval in Lane Cove. These fields should (fingers crossed!) be finished by mid-November, allowing us to not only start a new competition before Christmas at Blackman Oval but also to move the post-Christmas competition there as well. Until now we have played this competition at the Ku-ring-gai Hockey Centre, however Blackman will provide a better surface for football and a better experience for players. We are excited to get the new comps at Blackman up and running.



Finally I would like to extend a big vote of thanks to everyone who has contributed to making these competitions so special over the past 12 months. In no particular order:

- Brian Binfield, the master of transporting, constructing, deconstructing, advising and generally doing anything that needed doing. All the while managing to find time to referee with a smile on his face
- Andy Bayles, barbecuer to the stars
- Ian Mackay, who can get fields marked irrespective of floods, fires or anything in between
- Marcia Allman, who stoically managed a change of registration systems yet was still happy to put her hand up to volunteer time to help manage the new Mills Park competition
- All of the Team Managers, without whom we wouldn't have our competitions.

Looking forward to seeing you all at the ground this summer.

Special Needs Football

Every year each Club within the NSFA work to provide assistance within the local and overseas community. One of the ways our sporting families have found to give help and support to players overseas, is to give their old strips to those who do not have the financial assistance to purchase for their teams.

Two of our Clubs who have provided this assistance this year have been Hornsby RSL Youth and West Pymble.

President Matt Wall from Hornsby RSL writes:

In 2013 Mr Mario Machado, CEO of Hornsby RSL Club travelled to South Africa with the intention of visiting his old primary school in Mozambique. Unfortunately, due to instability in the region Mario could not attend his old school. However, he did manage to travel to Zimbabwe school for orphans.

There are around 150 disadvantaged kids at the school with 120 of the kids orphaned from the aids epidemic and other conflicts.

Hornsby RSL Youth FC donated complete playing kits consisting of old jerseys, socks and shorts, a kit bag, goalie gloves, goalie shirts, ball and pump.

This year, 2014, Hornsby RSL Youth FC has organised old football boot donations that will go over early next year along with more old kit.

Special Needs football

St Ives Football Club have had a Special Needs Football program running since 2004. The program is aimed at those children with intellectual disabilities with autistic spectrum disorder and down syndrome and provides a supported and fun environment in which the children can participate.

A set of rules has been developed to provide one-on-one guidance to the participants as they play. Each player is allowed to have a chaperone on the field to assist and direct the player and it is hoped that once familiar with the play the player will become less dependent on the chaperone until able to play independently. Games are played on Saturday afternoons Toolang Oval, St Ives.

Technical Director's Report

The Australian football community, including the NSFA community, is embracing a football culture that promotes a technical, attacking, possession-based game. The growth and success of the A-League and the W-League, the World Cup performances of the Socceroos and the Matildas, and the recent introduction of the FFA Cup (where our own Northern Tigers men's team went so close to entering the final round of 32, losing the final playoff game) have all contributed to driving interest in the game to a new level.

The 'beautiful game' in this country continues to evolve, and within NSFA we are working to stay ahead of the curve through our coach and player development programs. Over the past 12 months player development and coach development opportunities within the NSFA have continued to grow. Existing programs have been strengthened and new programs have been introduced for both community football and elite football.

Well done to all the coaches who are contributing to the growth of the game and enjoyment of the players in NSFA.

Community Football

Coach Education

Early in 2014 FFA released the new Community Coach Education course content that supports the National Curriculum. NSFA was amongst the first associations to run the new courses. With the introduction of minimum coaching standards in the Diamond League and the Boys U12 Division 1 competition, the quality of coaching within the NSFA football community will continue to improve, ultimately benefiting player enjoyment of the game and the football experience for all. Increasing the number of qualified coaches within the Association remains one of NSFA's key priorities.

NSFA Football School

The NSFA Football School has now been operating for two years, running on Monday and Friday nights during all 4 school terms. The Football School is a training program (including Goalkeeper specific training) that aligns with the National Curriculum for community players aged U6 to U14. The aim of the program is to provide an opportunity for community players to receive professional coaching in addition to their club training that is all year round. This can be especially helpful for some Clubs who can only allocate some of their teams one hour of training per week on local grounds.

Participation in the past 12 months has increased by 66% and 2014 saw the introduction of the Football School to the north of the Association with sessions being held at Mills Park. Head Coach Greg Beirne (B Licence) and the coaching team have played an important role in the participants' development.

NSFA School Holiday Clinics

School holiday clinics cater for all community players from U6 to U14. They have proved very popular again with record participant numbers this year: 814 compared to 546 in the previous 12 months. The holiday clinic coaches are all accredited and most are Northern Tigers coaching staff and players, which also helps to strengthen the relationship between grassroots football and the Tigers. In July and September we introduced Girls Only holiday clinics with exclusively female coaches that proved to be very successful.

Representative Football

NSFA Skill Acquisition Program (SAP)

SAP forms part of the FNSW official pathway for talented players and is available to U9, U10 and U11 boys and girls. The NSFA teams, containing 64 players in total, compete against other Association and National Premier League Clubs. They are committed to complying with the National Curriculum guidelines in terms of coach qualifications, training practices and playing style to achieve the best development outcomes for the players. During the season SAP teams held training sessions with a number of local clubs to share the SAP experience with players, coaches and parents.

SAP Head Coach, Steve Hurd (A Licence), along with the other SAP coaches, players and parents, represented NSFA with distinction.

Regional League

NSFA entered teams in the FNSW Regional League competition for the first time in 2014. This competition is for boys aged U12, U13, U14 and U15. It is a representative team selected from players registered with NSFA clubs. These players continued to play with their Club team as well as participate in the Regional League competition. Regional League bridges the gap between the National Premier League football (Northern Tigers FC) and Division 1 Club football. It provides these players and coaches with an additional challenge and a further development opportunity. Well done to Head Coach Brendan Dalton (B Licence) and the Regional League coaching team and players on a strong season.

FNSW State Titles

A number of Northern Suburbs players and coaches were successful in being selected to represent Met Far North at the State Titles held in July and September – both boys and girls teams, ranging from U12 to U16s.

A highlight was the winning U14 Met Far North Girls. The teams are drawn from players residing within the NSFA and Central Coast Football boundaries.

I expect the appetite for player and coach development programs will continue to increase in 2015, plans are in place to satisfy the growing demand and I'm looking forward to assisting the football culture in NSFA develop further.

In 2014 we have seen the benefits of the Northern Tigers focus on player development coming through to success on the field, further improving the reputation we have built up in the FNSW community and as an Association leading the development of players.

7 out of the 13 Northern Tigers teams made the Finals, with two other teams narrowly missing. The table below shows the respective performance of all the teams.

Our Girls Football teams have enjoyed a nucleus of players for a number of seasons and as a result performed exceptionally well, with the U15 & U17 Girls becoming minor premiers with two competition games remaining.

Youth in 2014

Our Boys Youth teams played a total of 88 games and finished 5th in the Club Championship. Northern Tigers focus in these age groups is player development and equipping the boys to play football in the right way to equip them for the Seniors Football from age 16 upwards. With this focus we were still able to be very competitive with our U12's finishing second and winning the Grand Final.

Seniors in 2014

Our Senior Men (U16 to First Grade) had a very strong season always being in the top 3 in the Club Championship (made up of U18, U20 & First Grade results). Going into the last game of the season we were competing with 3 to take out the Club Championship and achieve promotion, unfortunately we narrowly missed out.

Our U16's after losing their first 5 games, turned the season around with a strong winning streak and only losing 2 out of 17 games and unfortunately just missing out of the Finals.

Our U18's were strong throughout the season finishing 4th and proceeding to the Finals being knocked out in the Preliminary Final.

Our First Grade, with a number of new players, were in the running all season and with a couple of disappointing end of season results finished 4th, again progressing to the Finals and being eliminated in the Preliminary Final.

Our U20's had an extremely successful season – achieving the double, taking out the Minor Premiership and winning the Grand Final .

2014 was the inaugural year of the Westfield FFA Cup, a cup competition featuring Association, Representative and A League Clubs. Northern Tigers featured strongly not just in getting down to the last 32 (missing out to Parramatta) but also in the promotion video used on Fox Sports and the FFA Cup website. Women and Girls in 2014

In 2014 FNSW changed the competition structure by increasing by 1 year the age groups for Girls Football to U13, U15 & U17. In line with a number of other Representative teams Northern Tigers struggled to get Senior Women Players, which was reflected in the final position achieved in the Club Championship coming 5th out of 8.

However, the highlight of the season was the performance of the U13, U15 & U17 teams. During the season all 3 teams were leading the competition, with both the U15 & U17 Girls finishing as Minor Premiers and the U13's finishing in 3rd position.

All 3 teams progressing to the Grand Final play offs with all 3 teams making it to the Grand Final, and all playing against Sutherland Sharks. The U15 & U17 teams won the Grand Final, crowning off the season by achieving 'The Double'.

Football Development

The quality of Northern Tigers Coaches remained in 2014 one of the highest in FNSW with 2 'A' Licence, 1 'B' Licence and 9 'C' Licence. A number of the Coaches are in the process of taking their qualifications to the next level which will further strengthen our position in 2015.

Off the back of our success in 2013 as being recognised by FNSW assessors as one of the leading clubs for football development we were pleased to maintain our status in 2014. This high level of coaching has directly flowed to Association Clubs and their players through the NSFA Football School, Coach Education and Holiday Coaching Clinics all run by Northern Tigers Coaches.

Off the Field

During 2014 Northern Tigers supported the community both in Australia and overseas.

Our Girls and Women raised \$1,200 for McGrath Foundation with Pink Day on Sunday 8 June.

Last year's kit was once again put to good use through donating to Live Connection Aid with kit being distributed to Africa and Northern Territories.

A number of our Under 15 & 16 players have just returned from a tour of the UK, where they were fortunate to see 8 games of Football in the EPL, Champions League and Capital Club.

The boys and their coach were fortunate to enjoy some great experiences, from meeting the Man City and Roma players off the bus before the game as well as being Flag Bearers at the Stoke City game against Newcastle.

After an impressive 5-1 win against Newcastle Under Lyme University Football Development Academy the boys were rewarded with a stay at St Georges Park, England Football's development facility where they experienced hydro therapy and much more.

As the representative arm of the Northern Suburbs Football Association the Northern Tigers Committee have continued to reduce the cost of running a representative teams, reducing again in 2014 by 17% on 2013 coming \$ 24k below budget. In 2014 we were successful in obtaining a grant of \$1,500 from Telstra, and Sponsorship in excess of \$ 8,000. Over a 3 year period the cost of Northern Tigers has been reduced by 136% from the level of level of 2011, therefore reducing the contribution required from member Clubs.

Attention is turning to 2015 season with the SAP (U9 to U11) coming under the Northern Tigers umbrella providing a development path from age 9 through to First Grade. We see this as a continuation of the journey to build the strong foundations for future success. Developing players in a positive, encouraging and caring environment where they can develop to achieve their aspirations. Trials will commence in November and at the time of writing this in early October we already have 413 players registered to trial.

We have successfully retained the majority of our Coaches and have made some difficult strategic decisions to further strengthen the calibre and quality of our coaching, with Jason Eagar stepping down as Men's First Grade Coach to spend more time as Technical Director, replaced by Steve Hurd fresh on his success as U20's Coach. Along with two new A Licence Coaches to lead the Women's First Grade and U20's.

From all the Players, Coaches and Volunteers involved in the Northern Tigers we would like to thank the member Clubs for their continued support. Their recognition that having a Representative arm to the Association is an important pathway for football development, which helps ensure continued playing membership against stiff competition from other codes.

FACILITIES REPORT



Blackman Oval, nearing completion in November 2014

The synthetic revolution is here!

In 2014 NSFA welcomed Charles Bean Sportsground as the latest synthetic football field in our catchment area to add to Northbridge Oval. Blackman Oval was due to be completed sometime this season but weather delays and construction issues made that timetable unachievable. However we will have 2 new synthetic fields at Blackman Oval for use in 2015.

Willoughby Council has also announced that synthetic fields will be constructed at Chatswood High School and Thomson Park in Artarmon for 2015. Both of these fields are used as school playgrounds and have night training on them and as a consequence are usually in terrible condition by half way through the year. Indeed Chatswood High School was closed for match play in July as there was no grass of any substance on the playing surface, making it impossible to mark the field.

North Sydney Council is planning to convert Cammeray Oval into synthetic by the beginning of the 2015 winter season and the North Turramurra Recreation Area (NTRA) project is projected to have one synthetic field (as well as two new grass fields) by 2016. The plan is to have the fields at NTRA operating as a 'home of football' for the Association, for use by a number of different types of programs from MiniRoos right through to elite adult football.

The value of synthetic fields was brought into sharp relief during a very wet August. Because we had the facility at Charles Bean we were able to finish a large number of competitions which otherwise would not have finished.

Also, as a dedicated football facility we have been able to enjoy year-round use of the facility for both our elite football programs and for local clubs. In 2014 we were also able to play a number of Saturday night matches (5:00 and 7:00) which were very well received and also U18 matches on Friday nights.

While synthetic fields represent an advance in facilities, they remain the exception rather than the rule and we continue to work on maximising the use of all available grass pitches while still acting in a sustainable manner. The much delayed Koola Park project is now slated to commence in early 2015 and Koola is likely to be out of action well into 2016. The plans are for 2 dedicated football fields, one Rugby Union field and one composite rugby/football field.

The upgrade to Allan Small (aka Saiala) was finally completed in July this year, albeit with restricted usage. However with a new surface and match quality lights we hope to make full use of the ground in 2015.

The upgrade to the floodlights at Berowra was completed this year and 2 Men's All Age fixtures were scheduled for Saturday evenings. The first was a Premier League fixture between Berowra and Mt Colah in July which attracted between 300 and 700 people, depending on who you talk to. It is planned that more Saturday night matches will be scheduled at Berowra in 2015. A lighting upgrade is also planned to take place at Warrimoo Oval.

A major project taking shape at the moment is the refurbishment of Montview Oval. The project is being funded by Hornsby Council (two thirds) and by a NSW Government Community Building grant secured by Hornsby Heights Sports Club (one third).

The works involve replacing the current surface and levelling the entire area, improving the drainage, installing irrigation including a water-collecting tank and replacing the cricket wickets. The project is due for completion in time for the 2015 winter season.

In 2014 West Pymble FC refurbished the clubhouse/amenities block at Norman Griffiths Oval. The project was funded via accumulated club members' funds, a grant of \$120,000 from the NSW Government Community Grants fund and a \$30,000 contribution from Ku-ring-gai Council towards improvements to the amenities part of the building. Apart from the improvements to the dressing sheds and bathrooms the new building boasts a larger meeting room and canteen and a raised viewing area with a storage area underneath. A disabled toilet has also been added. This project was driven completely by West Pymble and they now have a great facility. Next project; a synthetic playing surface!

Finally, congratulations to Sacred Heart Pymble FC, which was successful in obtaining State government funding for renovations at its home ground. We remind Clubs that funding opportunities exist for those Clubs looking to upgrade their local facilities. Please contact facilities@nsfa.asn.au if your Club has a worthy project, as the Association is committed to helping Clubs achieve their own goals in this area.

The challenges for NSFA moving forward in the facilities area are managing fields better to alleviate wear and tear, optimising grounds for Men's football on Saturday afternoons and finding 60m x 40m fields for Under 10's and Under 11's on Saturday mornings. It is no secret that most wear and tear is caused by training so another challenge is to find better, more efficient ways to train or better still alternative places to train.
