PRESIDENT'S REPORT

In 2019 the NSFA entered the third year of its strategic plan Towards 2020: NSFA Strategic Plan. Our simple vision is encapsulated in that plan: for our football community to experience the joy of football. By articulating areas for development in Community Football Experience, Facilities, Pathways, and Creativity & Innovation we continue to make positive innovation in our Association and so move towards achieving this vision.

Community football is at the heart of our Association. In 2019 the competitions department (Damian Miles and Adam Cloughton) improved the quality of the administration of the competitions; they provided quick solutions to enable as many competitive games to be played as possible; while the final series led to some exciting climaxes to our season.

The football experience for players, officials and spectators has been enhanced by the further development of coaching resources and expertise within the Association. More coaches than ever took advantage of the Inspire program to improve the training experience of their players while XLR8 was taken up by more clubs as a way to support player development alongside club coaches. Ed Ferguson, Nick Marr and Eilidh Mackay have made these programs a real success. They should also be congratulated for continuing our targeted promotion of girls' football through the Skellern Cup, now in its third year. In 2019, 800 girls from 20 schools across the Association took part and shared in the joy of football together.

The improvement of facilities remains a priority for our Association. Paul Orgad has done an excellent job in supporting this goal, working closely with councils to get the best results we can with the current facilities while also supporting initiatives to bring improvements, including more applications for synthetic pitches and the longer term goal of a home of football at NTRA. We have made some progress towards the latter goal, with strong support from Ku-ring-gai councillors.

This year we celebrated real progress again in our representative club, the Northern Tigers. The club finished second in Women's NPL1 Club Championship (up from 8th two years ago) and second also in the men's NPL2 Club Championship. In particular, the women's team have gone from strength to strength in NPL1. The First Grade team did us proud in the Grand Final, as did the G17 team in their Grand Final. I would

like to acknowledge the leading roles that Jason Eagar and Eilidh Mackay have played in making this success possible.

Communication with our members has been greatly enhanced this year through the work of Nick Amies. Our social media presence has grown and given us a real footprint in the community. This was something that had previously been missing and our current reach and impact have allowed us to share more of what has been happening in our Association with a larger number of members.

Thanks should also go to Alan Clarke for keeping the Association books in good order as well as his timely and comprehensive advice to the Board each month. This has allowed us to keep a close eye on the financial impact of strategic decisions.

I would especially like to thank the volunteers for all the hours you put in and the passion you show for community football. The hard working volunteers across the member clubs are what make it possible for our community as a whole to experience the joy of football; a particular thank you to Alan Clarke for chairing the PD&DC and to the other members of that committee.

I would in particular like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the outstanding job done by the NSFA CEO, Malcolm Waldo and to express my profound thanks to him for all he has done for our Association. Over the past three years he has been a real driving force for improvement in every aspect of what we do, on and off the field. His passion and commitment can clearly be seen both in the creation of the Towards 2020: NSFA Strategic Plan in conjunction with the Board and in the realisation of its goals. It has been his vision and dynamic presence in the office that have brought real and positive change. There is no doubt that the fantastic progress we have made over the past three years across the Association could not have come about without his expertise and dedication. Malcolm: thank you for all you have done for us.

I would also like thank the Board of Directors: Hilary Bingham, Lee Sullivan, Brett Backhouse, Simon Cox, Mick Da Silva, Sarah Jenkins and James Sneddon. The Board members are all diligent, hard-working and committed volunteers who have worked together as a strong and cohesive team to ensure that we realise the vision we share in our love of football.

CEO'S REPORT

Over the past three years the NSFA has been guided by its "Towards 2020" Strategic Plan. It has been a period characterised by some rapid and at times transformational change, but always with the underpinning principle of aligning all our stakeholders behind the simple vision of helping our community experience the joy of football.

In season 2019, more players experienced the joy of football than in any other year in the association's history. 16,868 players ranging in age from four to seventy-six laced up their boots for our winter season, proving once again that our game is the most accessible and inclusive sport in the country.

The season was also highlighted by record numbers of females playing the game, closing in on 4000 players for the first time. Most pleasingly of all, our retention rates in the MiniRoos and Youth Girls categories jumped significantly. With many improvements and initiatives to be launched for season 2020, we are well on the way to our target of 5000 + female players in the NSFA.

One of the many highlights for the female game in season 2019 was our third annual Skellern Cup tournament for primary school girls. Close to 800 girls engaged with football over a fun filled two-day festival at NTRA. Thanks to the members of our Community Football department; Ed Ferguson, Eilidh Mackay and Nick Marr; for making this event an absolute highlight of the football calendar.

Of course, the surge in popularity and the insatiable demand for football twelve months a year also puts pressure on our finite playing fields and infrastructure. Over the last three years we have worked closely with all levels of government to conceptualise, co-fund and implement facilities projects. I would like to thank all of our elected representatives for supporting the beautiful game. Prominent football media personality, Andy Harper, summed it up eloquently when he encouraged politicians of all persuasions to "serve the numbers."

Football unites communities and is an antidote to isolation in an increasingly disconnected world. The ability to engage and connect with your local football club is an invaluable helping hand in the quest for optimal mental health. Our booming

participation rates and projected increases in population will ensure that facilities are always a major priority. We hope that government continues to "serve the numbers" and support the vital role that our sport plays in building active, healthy and engaged communities.

Thanks also to our Facilities Manager Paul Orgad for advocating so effectively on our behalf and ensuring that football's voice is commensurate with its participation levels. Fulfilling our ambitions of building a genuine Home of Football at NTRA remains a significant priority for the association, and Paul's work on this project along with significant contributions from humble and selfless volunteers such as Enzo Marchione and Rob Lloyd have not gone unnoticed.

Across the year our commitment to investing in the capability of all coaches continued apace. INSPIRE has become the NSFA coaches go to resource for session planning and delivery. From humble beginnings I can now proudly say that 1200 + coaches receive this material direct to their inbox every Sunday lunchtime. The standard of coaching within the NSFA has increased dramatically across the board, further supported by our flourishing Club Coach Co-ordinator program (CCC) and face to face coach education programs offered free of charge to all NSFA Coaches.

XLR8 was conceptualised in 2017 and has quickly become the premier player development vehicle within the NSFA through a combination of in club programs, specialised coaching and holiday clinics. Player development has been systematically enhanced across the association and the added benefit is that any commercial success is invested straight back into the association. Thank you to the twelve NSFA Clubs who partnered with XLR8 in 2019. This represented significant year on year growth and is poised to expand again for season 2020.



At the very epicentre of the NSFA is our Winter Competitions. With a record number of teams participating I want to thank Damian Miles and Adam Cloughton for their coverage, commitment and execution of this year's competitions. This is the second year of insourced competitions management. Running competitions in-house has enabled the NSFA to be nimbler and more adaptable, leading to dramatically enhanced efficiency, productivity, timeliness and objectivity. We now have more games, finals series, quality development leagues and more value for money.

CEO'S REPORT

Congratulations to Northbridge FC for pulling off the Men's and Women's Premier League double in 2019. A magnificent achievement and the culmination of many years of hard work by a lot of dedicated people. Not the least of whom was Kym Griffen who moved to the Far North Coast this year and was absent from the NSFA landscape for the first time in many long years. I would like to thank Kym personally for his many progressive achievements and contributions to the association. It was his involvement and passion that ignited my administrative involvement in the game, and I know that I am one of many that he has inspired over the years. Thank you, Kym, for everything you have done.



Season 2020 will see the introduction of the new NSFA SAP League, a reboot of the Girls Diamond League and further improvements in our Super League competitions. Additionally, we are launching the Sapphires program to enhance the enjoyment of female MiniRoos players and as a foundation step for transition into the Diamond League. Our development pathways are producing better quality players for tomorrow and increasing the depth of engagement with football on the North Shore of Sydney.

I would also like to acknowledge the giant strides forward we have made in terms of our Social Media and Digital channels. In 2016 the NSFA had a very limited appreciation of how social and digital platforms could be optimised to increase engagement. For those of you who might remember our old NSFA and Northern Tigers websites, the refresh could not come soon enough. Thank you to Nick Amies for delivering on a total revamp of our digital strategy. Our social media, newsletters, and web presence are now contemporary, consistent, commercially useful and educational. A massive step forward.

Everyone should be incredibly proud of the Northern Tigers Football Clubs achievements in season 2019. Of our twelve teams competing in the FNSW NPL, eight made finals. Our Men's Under 20s team went the distance and defeated a

talented Western Sydney Wanderers Academy team for a well deserved Grand Final win. Our Women's first Grade team qualified for our first ever NPL 1 Grand Final. Against the might of the all-powerful Sydney University Football Club, we held level after 120 minutes of football only to lose out on penalties. Thank you to Jason Eagar for his fabulous commitment to the NSFA's representative pathway.



Without question the unsung hero of the NSFA Office is Alan "Clarkey" Clarke. His selfless dedication to chairing a dedicated team of P&D volunteers should never be underestimated. Thank you to all of those who gave up their time to serve on the P&D Committee in 2019. I would also like to thank Clarkey for his counsel and wisdom over the last three years. He is a calming influence on all those around him.

I would also like to thank Alan Woods and Dimitrios Gongolidis for their leadership of the KDFRA. Once again it goes without saying that without referees, we have no game. In 2019 our coverage levels improved, and the number of disciplinary incidents was significantly reduced. Thanks to all referees for their significant contributions.

Sadly, this is my last year as CEO of the Association. I would like to thank the NSFA Board for the privilege of allowing me to undertake this role and their ongoing support, strategic thinking and stability. To every club President, administrator and volunteer, you know that I have the utmost empathy and admiration for what you do. There was one significant change to competition structures in 2019.

For the first time since 1998, the Mixed Over 35 competition was conducted as single-team divisions on a 2-year trial basis. To aid in the transition, concessions were made on the borrowing of players between teams and the draw was structured in such a way that a quasi-squad type environment was maintained, at least in Divisions 1-4.

Another change this year was adding the Under 18 Junior Mixed competition to Super League. In 2020 the Girl's Under 18 Division 1 will become a Diamond League competition, meaning every Junior age-group will have an elite division at its apex.

Once again, the weather was reasonably kind this year with all competitions reaching a conclusion. Unfortunately, rain struck on grand final day causing several grand finals to be postponed. Fortunately, we managed to scramble up some more ground availability and in the end all but 4 of these grand finals were played.

Congratulations to Mount Colah FC who took out the Club Championship this year. It was a very close race with Northbridge and Lindfield figuring in the top 3 for the first time.



SENIOR MIXED FOOTBALL

Player numbers for 2019 increased by 161, or 4.1%. The 4081 Senior Mixed participants were a record for the Association and only the second time we have reached 4000 (2010 was the other). All Age numbers increased by 6.5% with an increase of 8 teams. Over 45s grew by 8.5% with 4 extra teams and Over 35s dropped by over 4%. However, many of those Over 35 players moved to Over 45s. The net gain in these age groups was 36 extra players spread over 3 fewer teams.

ALL AGE

2019 was an historic year for Premier League at both ends of the table. Northbridge FC won their first title in first grade, finishing 8 points clear of second-placed Willoughby Dalleys. At the other end of the ladder St Michael's will return to Division 2 after one season while Kissing Point will not appear in Premier League for the first time since 1977.

Premier League football returns to Hornsby Shire in 2020 with both Berowra (Premiers) and Mt Colah securing promotion from Division Two. West Pymble secured their 3rd promotion in a row in taking out Division 4 honours. Elsewhere Lane Cove won the Division 3 and Division 6 titles and Old Barker FC took out Division 5.



OVER 35

North Sydney United enjoyed emphatic wins in both Division 1 and Division 2 in 2019. In Division 3 Chatswood Rangers prevailed over North Sydney United by 4 points while the men from Cammeray took out Division 4 by just 1 point.

Mt Colah won Division 5 while new boys North Turrumurra B triumphed in Division 6.

OVER 45

St Michael's won their 4th successive Division 1 title and also finished top of Division 2. Prouille were victorious in Division 3.

Over 45 football was somewhat problematic this year with a lack of depth at the top. We are continuing to look at ways of

overcoming these issues and improving the experience for all participants.

CUPS

The NSFA Cup returned to Charles Bean Sportsground (formerly UTS Oval) this year for the first time since 1998.

The match was a Willoughby derby with Willoughby Dalleys taking on Chatswood Rangers. In a thrilling contest with some stunning goals Rangers took an early 2-0 lead. Dalleys scored late in the first half to peg one back but a goal from Rangers straight after half time seemed to have decided the contest but again Dalleys fought back to halve the deficit. However, a late breakaway goal to Rangers as Dalleys pushed for an equaliser saw the score finish 4-2 to Rangers, handing them the title for the fifth time.



The Rick Close Cup was also an enjoyable contest with Lane Cove up against perennial finalists North Sydney United. Norths opened the scoring early with a stunning 30-yard volley and early in the second half they had opened up a 3-0 lead. Lane Cove did not give up however and pressed the North Sydney goal on several occasions in the second half, finally scoring a stunner of their own. Eventually North Sydney secured their fourth successive derby, winning the match 3-1.

STATE CUP

Six teams entered State Cup in 2020; Northbridge PL and AA2, North Sydney United PL and AA2 and North Sydney United O35 1's and 2's. Unfortunately, it was a tough tournament for NSFA teams with only North Sydney PL and both North Sydney O35 teams bowing out in the Round of 16.

CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS

We entered 4 teams in Champion of Champions. These were Northbridge (PL), North Sydney United (O35), St Michael's (O45) and Mongo FC Under 21. Mongo FC were knocked out in Round 2, while St Michael's bowed out in the Quarter Finals. Both Northbridge and North Sydney United reached the semi-finals but were narrowly defeated.

JUNIOR MIXED FOOTBALL

SUPER LEAGUE

Super League was expanded this year to include Under 18. The Under 18s turned out to be the closest finish with Lindfield prevailing by 3 points. All other SL competitions were decided by large margins.

All SL competitions started the season with 8 teams apart from Under 12 which started with 10 teams. Unfortunately, we then removed a team from Under 13 after 5 rounds due to their results.

While there were still teams that struggled to compete, the fact that every division boasted at least 8 teams was very pleasing. We have made some progress from 2018 and we are sure this will continue into 2018.



CUPS

Congratulations to Lindfield, who were represented in all three Cup finals, and both teams in the Vice President's Shield final! It was the 15A's who won the all-Lindfield affair in a tense penalty shootout against the 16A's.

West Pymble triumphed in a thrilling Treasurer's Shield final, while in the President's Shield Lindfield needed a golden goal winner against North Sydney United to take home the trophy.

STATE CUP

In all 35 NSFA Junior Mixed teams entered State Cup in 2019. It was a difficult tournament for all our teams with only 1 team getting to the final. Hornsby Heights were in fact defeated in the semi-final but received a reprieve when the other team was found to have breached the competition rules. With only 2 days' notice that they were playing the team put up a great fight before going down 3-1.

CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS

The following clubs represented NSFA in this tournament: Mongo FC (U12), Lindfield (U13, U15, U17 & U18), North Sydney United (U14) & Hornsby Heights (U16). The Lindfield U13 and U18 progressed to the finals, where the U13 secured the trophy with a 5-1 win over Auburn FC. Unfortunately the U18 went down 4-3 in a thrilling match against Glenmore Park.

GIRLS & WOMEN'S FOOTBALL

With the new competition structure in place for the second consecutive season, 2019 for Girls and Women's Football was a very successful one. The current structure places an emphasis on maximising the number of competition games played. The season consisted of 17 rounds plus finals for Juniors and 19 rounds plus finals for seniors. The Finals series is proving to be very popular and is an exciting way to finish the season.

It was pleasing to see growth in Girls and Women's Football in 2019. There was an increase of over 200 Female players when compared to 2018. This was particularly evident in the Girls MiniRoos competition, which increased by 33%. The re-branding of Girls MiniRoos to 'Sapphires' in 2020 will hopefully continue the growth of Girls Football. The aim of Sapphires is to provide a positive and engaging environment which will help attract and retain girls in club football.



One of the main challenges each season is the allocation of teams in divisions. As was the case last year, grading took place at the Presidents Workshop in March, with the Presidents working together to resolve any grading disputes. In some cases, we had to be creative and flexible with the competition structure to try and achieve our goal of forming fair and competitive divisions. This was evident in the G16 Diamond League and WO35 Division 1 competitions, where we initially formed large divisions, with both divisions then being split.

In 2019 we re-branded the WAA division 1 competition to 'Premier League' and expanded the competition from six to eight teams. The three teams promoted from division two, UTS, Turramurra United and West Pymble, all performed very well

and added a lot of value to the Premier League competition. Congratulations to Northbridge A, who have now won the WAA Div. 1/Premier League competition for a 5th consecutive season.



Once again, the State Cup was a very popular competition for our Girls and Women's teams. We had 24 teams enter the competition, an increase from the 19 teams we had in 2018. The State Cup resulted in a number of fixtures being postponed, but being able to use facilities such as Charles Bean, Cammeray, Northbridge, NTRA and Blackman enabled us to reschedule the majority of fixtures. Unfortunately, none of the teams were able to win the State Cup, however, G12 Chatswood Rangers and G14 Lindfield both reached the Semi-Final. West Pymble G16 went one better, making it all the way to the Grand Final. Unfortunately, they went down to Pittwater RSL FC.



NSFA teams competed well in the Champion of Champions competition, with three teams reaching the Semi-Finals and all teams progressing through to the quarters. Northbridge G16's went on to win the competition, recording an emphatic win in the Final, defeating Bonnyrigg FC 7-1.



The G18 shield took place for the fifth time. Northbridge secured back-to-back titles, defeating Lindfield again in the final. Unfortunately, only four teams entered the G18 shield this year. In 2020 the competition will be rebranded into a Women's Cup, open to G18, WAA and W035 teams to hopefully provide a greater standard of competitiveness.

MINIROOS FOOTBALL

In 2019 the association had 6775 registered MiniRoos Players, which is down 2.05% from 2018. MiniRoos players represent 40% of all registered players in the association. Despite the decrease in player numbers, we still recorded the same number of teams (613) as we did in 2018.



As has been the case for the past few seasons, MiniRoos re-grading occurred every five rounds. An automated methodology that was implemented by Dale Catzel a number of years ago is used when re-grading. The re-grading was effective in minimising the goal difference between teams, improving the game day experience of all players.

A big thankyou goes out to all the volunteers, ground controllers, managers and coaches that help MiniRoos football run so smoothly every weekend.

SUMMER FOOTBALL REPORT

Each year we reflect on the Summer Football season which took place in the prior calendar year. The 2018 Summer Football season recorded a significant spike in growth, with 310 teams and over 2,500 players registered across three venues. The venues used in 2018 were Blackman Park, Mills Park and North Turramurra Recreation Area (NTRA).

In 2018 we expanded the competition at NTRA to include Monday nights. As a result, we went from 51 teams (2017) to 96 teams (2018). On Mondays we have more of a Junior focus, with the U10 and U11 competition proving to be very popular. We also have an U12/13, U15, G16 and have recently introduced a WO35 competition. Wednesdays is more of a Senior focus, with the WAA, MAA, Mixed and MO35 competition all reaching capacity.

At Blackman we were stretched to capacity with over 120 teams registering for the Tuesday night competition. The competition grew by 28 teams from 2017. Whilst it was pleasing to see so many teams registered, the increase in team numbers had its challenges, especially when it came to referee coverage. At Blackman we have eight 6-side fields set up across two synthetic fields, the junior games start at 17:00 with the last game finishing at 22:00. We offer competitions for almost every age group, ranging from Under 8's to Men's O45's.

At Mills Park we had 90 teams registered over two nights. The decision was made to drop Wednesday nights so that we could consolidate the competition to Tuesday's and Thursdays. This allowed us to form more balanced and competitive divisions.



Electronic Match Cards were used for the 2017 & 2018 season. However, this provided many challenges. One of the challenges was getting players allocated into teams. Unfortunately this had to be done manually which meant that a lot of players weren't allocated in time. Referees also had issues accessing and reviewing the EMC. For the 2019 season the decision was made to revert back to paper match cards and it has proven to be a popular decision.



Last year NSFA had three teams represent the association in the Summer Football Champion of Champions tournament. Our representatives were Culcha (WAA), Pasa Stallions (MAA) & Turra Tigers in the Mixed competition. The Turra Tigers went onto win the Mixed Competition for the second consecutive season. The event is held over one day at Valentine Sports Park.

Overall the 2018 season ran very smoothly, with teams playing the game in a positive spirit which made it a very enjoyable experience for everyone. A very big thankyou to the NSFA Ground controllers, Maggie Humphreys, Bryce Nielsen, Brian Binfield, Marcis Morgan, Sando Papikian, Heidi Caspers, James Baker and Krisha Karla for their excellent work last year and their continued efforts this year.

It is with pleasure I submit the PD&DC report for the 2019 season.

Generally speaking, it was an uneventful season from a PD&DC perspective except for a few extraordinary matters that came before the committee. As the statistics below show, there was a very pleasing trend in player discipline with a decrease of 22.87% in send offs & only a marginal increase in cautions.

After taking into account misconduct reports, the committee dealt with 211 matters which was 72 less than in 2018 (283), which made for very few late nights during the season.

The highly pleasing statistic is the reduction of nearly 50% in players sent off for R6 (using offensive, insulting or abusive language &/or gestures). This suggests that the introduction of temporary dismissals of players for dissent has made a highly positive impact on player behaviour. Hopefully this trend will continue in following seasons.

There was also a significant reduction in the number of players suspended for accrued cautions, 45 in 2019, down from 78 in 2018.

FACILITIES REPORT

2019 was another year of progress and development. Several projects were completed and pleasingly many more are to come, with local Councils continuing their commitment and investment into sporting infrastructure. The weather gods were kind to us once again, with most of the year's rainfall arriving prior to the commencement of the winter season and again at seasons end. The ideal growing conditions we experienced in the off-season meant our natural grass fields were in their best condition for many years. The dry year (too dry at times) is reflected in the lower number of midweek games played this year compared to last season [100 against 181]. Thank you to those clubs who made their ground available to accommodate midweek matches.



The NSFA and its five local Councils remain dedicated to raising the standard of our facilities. Our collaborative efforts are often driven by the outcomes of need based studies such as The Future Needs of Sport, which was recently undertaken. It includes data from State Sporting Organisations, Councils and their stakeholders on sporting facility priorities. However, with limited capacity to increase the number of facilities in the area, the focus must be on how to improve our existing sites. Typically, this will include installation or an upgrade of floodlights, ensuring drainage and irrigation are present and where possible, surface renewal or even replacement with synthetic grass. NSFA remains on track with its goal of achieving 10 synthetic fields, however, the timing of this now appears to be delayed beyond the initial target of 2021.

Grants and Funding

Congratulations must go to St Ives FC who were awarded \$33,000 by the State Government via the My Community Project. In a first of its kind, eligible members of the community were able to vote for their favourite projects. Thanks to the NSFA members and those residing in the Davidson electorate for supporting this bid. The funds will be used to upgrade the lighting at **Warrimoo Oval**. Currently only two floodlight poles are installed resulting in less than half of the field being adequately illuminated. Hornsby RSL were assisted by State MP Matt Kean to purchase a new line marking machine for **Mills Park**. NSFA continues to invest time and resources into seeking funding from external sources and currently three applications are being assessed for a range of projects. I encourage all clubs wishing to apply for funding to contact me.



Greater Sydney Sports Facility Fund

Unfortunately, NSFA were not invited to stage 2 in 2018. Although we have scaled back our plans and are seeking a reduced amount of external funding, the structure will contain the elements required to be Football NSW compliant and will support our NPL1 ambitions for Northern Tigers and our desire to host Cup Final days, tournaments such as the Skellern Cup and others. We are staunchly determined to construct an amenity building and make our quest for a genuine "**Home of Football**" at NTRA, a reality. At the time of writing we await the Office of Sport to invite us to submit a detailed business case as part of the GSSFF grant in the latter part of this year.

Willoughby Council

It has been a busy period for Willoughby Council, with some large-scale projects being completed over the past year. Floodlights were installed and surface works completed at **Bicentennial Oval (Hallstrom Park)**, both of which were a welcome addition to our stock of midweek training venues. The first synthetic replacement in the NSFA took place at Northbridge Oval and despite the delays we have a much better product to use over the next 7-10 years. Federal MP Trent Zimmerman committed \$500,000 to an entirely new amenities building at **Thomson Park**. Construction is due to

start later this year, with Council currently assessing the tender responses. The massive redevelopment (Stage 1) at **Gore Hill** was finished earlier this year and NSFA is enjoying running a new 6-a-side competition at the venue, adding to our existing 3 sites. Looking forward, the hybrid courts at **The Willis Centre** will receive a new sub-base and court resurfacing. Works at **Mowbray Public School** have commenced, with the surface being removed and replaced, along with drainage and irrigation to be upgraded at the site.



North Sydney

Over the past 12 months Council have undertaken preliminary studies into the possibility of a second synthetic field in the LGA. Following several reports and community-based discussions, Council has agreed to test a small, high wear area at **Primrose Park #2** for the 2020 season. The goalmouth will be fitted with a hybrid product which involves combining synthetic yarn with reinforced fibres into existing natural turf. The synthetic fibres incorporated into the rootzone make the grass stronger and more resistant to damage. We await with interest as to the results of the trial and will continue liaising with Council as to the feasibility of a synthetic or “hybrid” field in the future.

Hornsby Council

Works to improve the drainage at **Asquith Oval** and the inclusion of an irrigation system was completed in April this year. Although there was a delay in access to the field, long term the investment made should further enhance this first-class facility. **Montview Oval** received a long-awaited upgrade to the floodlights. Thanks to the State Government and Football NSW for their contribution of \$125,000 (awarded to Hornsby Heights FC) via the Asian Cup grant. **Mount Ku-ring-gai Oval** has also been upgraded with new lighting, now enabling better utilisation of the entire playing area. **Parklands Oval** is due to receive the same upgrade in the near future, resulting in almost all Hornsby Shire grounds having received lighting upgrades over the past 5 years. A real testament to the Council's commitment to increasing the playing capacity of their sportsgrounds.

Lane Cove Council

Blackman Park Lower received a much-needed upgrade in late 2018, with a new playing surface installed plus drainage and irrigation. Aside from some unwanted vandalism on the eve of the season, the surface held up incredibly well throughout the year. Initial talks have taken place to upgrade the amenities block adjacent to **Blackman Lower**. This is perhaps the final piece of the puzzle in the overall Masterplan upgrade of the precinct. The amenities building at **Kingsford Smith Oval** will gain a fresh new look in the coming months with plans to upgrade and improve the layout. The updated structure will include a rear extension and an increase in available storage space, new change room areas and public toilet access.

Ku-ring-gai Council

The lighting at **Primula Oval** was completed and it now represents the first sportsground in NSFA to contain LED globes. The feedback has been positive and we await Council to determine its overall benefit both in lifespan and running costs.



The amenities building at **Samuel King** will receive a make-over with a fresh coat of paint, new showers, toilet cubicles and benches on the list of items to be replaced or upgraded. **Wellington Oval** and **Bannockburn** are the next two fields to receive natural turf upgrades, as Council commences their respective plans in the coming months. Late last year, following further investigation into the feasibility of converting **Norman Griffiths Oval** into a synthetic surface, a decision was made to explore transferring the project to **Mimosa Oval** due to the high cost involved in accommodating water detention and the mitigation building works which were required.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our member clubs and volunteers for their effort and ambition to develop and improve facilities within NSFA. Over the past year we have collaborated and assisted many clubs in purchasing equipment, installing storage solutions and advocating for increased funding and support. Special thanks to each of our five Councils who continue implementing strategies to overcome the demand issues faced on the North Shore of Sydney.

COACH DEVELOPMENT REPORT



Coach Development in NSFA continued to grow in strength and numbers in 2019, with record attendances involved in courses, mentoring and the INSPIRE Coach support program. Building on the 2018 season whereby a new approach to coach development was taken, the NSFA Coach Development team wasted no time in getting the ball rolling.

The Club Coach Coordinator (CCC) program grew to 22 clubs in 2019 to become the largest NSW-based program. Ed Ferguson and his team set their sights on building the capacity of clubs, through the expansion of the CCC team, and the capabilities of these people, with many becoming FFA accredited presenters. With new faces always comes new energy and some notable gains this season were Lane Cove FC who expanded their team to four members, Gordon SC who implemented many new ideas and initiatives to cultivate a more connected culture within the club, and many clubs delivering their own preseason workshop to welcome coaches

back for the 2019 season. The NSFA CCC program has taken on a life of its own. With 22 clubs involved there is 22 times the amount of coach development taking place and the result of this is a more connected and improved coaching culture with NSFA which sets us up well for future years.

Coach Education participants grew once again in 2019, with another strikingly positive outcome being the growth of NS-

FA's FFA Coach Education presenter team. With more Developers at the disposal of NSFA, the amount of opportunities and diverse learning opportunities has expanded. Six Skill Training Certificates were conducted throughout the calendar year to a total of 111 coaches gaining their accreditations. 43 participants gained their Game Training Certificate, despite regular cancellations due to rain during the early preseason months. The Youth Coach Development Program attracted a greater number of 15 – 22 year old's than before, now in its second year of delivery. Nearly 65 students took part with NSFA conducting two further YCDPs in the remaining months of 2019. Eleven ALDI MiniRoos courses were conducted with over 150 coaches also undertaking these.



A new introduction and focus in 2019 was towards Parent Education. A dedicated section of the website kicked off the new focus followed by NSFA's first 'Game Leader workshop' with an effort to inform, educate and exhibit the role of Game Leaders within MiniRoos football. The NSFA community responded outstandingly with over 120 parents joining Nick Marr and Ed Ferguson on the evening. To have over 120 engaged and interested parents is a huge asset to the association. Our aim is to continue the growth of this type of involvement with our parents and strengthen even more in 2020!

NSFA once again delivered a series of Coach Education workshops throughout the season to provide its members short and impactful experiences. In its second season, the NSFA Coach Education Expo boasted over 100 coaches in attendance whereby coaches were able to choose the workshop of their choice. The ALDI MiniRoos course on the evening was conducted by Eilidh Mackay (Northern Tigers FC), Josh Lazarus (St Ives FC & XLR8), Brendan Dalton (XLR8) and Ed Ferguson. An Introduction to SAP workshop was provided by Ollie

Stickland (Northern Tigers FC) and Craig Tyrie (XLR8) to cater for coaches of 9 – 13 years old. Nick Marr (NSFA / XLR8) was on hand to provide an Introduction to 11aside football with the assistance of Northern Tigers FC Under 14 squad. Another huge turnout at the Expo displays the importance and value our community places on coach education. The benefits from attending the expo and our courses will be felt for the full 18 weeks of the season and we hope for many future seasons as coaches grow in confidence and enjoyment within their role.

This year NSFA launched its Female Coach Mentoring program under the guidance of Eilidh Mackay (Northern Tigers FC Girls SAP Technical Director, Under 14 Boys Head Coach & XLR8 Head Coach) and Ed Ferguson. The programs aim was to provide a support and mentoring network to female coaches throughout NSFA. The program welcomed six females in its first year, with Mackay and Ferguson attending the participant's training sessions to provide feedback, discuss ideas and provide opportunities to allow more females to progress with their coaching. The mentoring program will continue to grow and boast the fantastic network of female coaches we currently have in NSFA. Moving forwards our aim is to grow the amount of female coaches, with our sights set on having 30% female coaches by 2023!

The INSPIRE Coach Support program blew the water out of the bucket in 2019 with over 1,100 coaches signed up to receive the weekly coach support newsletter. Each Sunday these coaches gained access to several newly-created curriculums to aid their session design, planning and most importantly the enjoyment and engagement of players. Coaches also received weekly coaching tips, links to blogs, football related articles and a wide range of videos to better coach and develop player skills.

NSFA confirmed its commitment to improvement within the community by once again supporting four local coaches in gaining their FFA C licence under the NSFA Coaching Scholarship. 2018 awardees attended their course during the summer break and worked towards completing this in 2019. The 2019 awardees are Ruth Bartos (Northbridge FC), Brad Morgan (Kissing Point FC), Marcus Swift (Lindfield FC) and Mackenzie Davis (North Sydney Utd FC), who will be undertaking their course during summer.



The season was rounded out in late August as NSFA hosted an end of season thank you evening for its Coach Education presenters, Club Coach Coordinators and members of the Female Football Working Group. The ever expanding and passionate team were provided a unique opportunity to hear from Kai Lammert, Head Coach of the Pararoos, and Catherine Cannuli, Technical Director at SD Raiders and W-League Assistant Coach of Western Sydney Wanderers. The gathering of 48 club officials shows the progress that has been made along with the strength of relationships as clubs shared their ideas, success stories and plans for the future.

NSFA would like to thank all coaches throughout NSFA for their effort, care, inspiration and time during the season. Coaches and volunteers are the backbone of grassroots sport and your role has been integral to ensuring the players have a memorable and enjoyable experience.

We hope to welcome you back in 2020 for what is going to be more eventful and promising!

XLR8 REPORT



XLR8 Player Development Programs hit the ground running in 2019 during its second year in operation and partnership with NSFA clubs. The XLR8 purpose is to provide all members within NSFA access to quality and appropriate player and coach development opportunities. Our association wide programs alongside our 12 partner clubs reached over 2,300 players each week during the season, providing enjoyable and engaging sessions for players to fall in love with football and develop themselves.

XLR8's Collaborative Coaching Program increased in size dramatically due to Kissing Point FC, Sacred Heart Pymble FC and Sacred Heart Mosman FC joining Chatswood Rangers as our partner clubs. The XLR8 Collaborative Coaching program provides a 'coach the coaches' experience, with XLR8 coaches overseeing the development of club coaches by utilising the methodologies and best practice technique of FFA Coach Education. Support was also provided to club coaches in the form of the INSPIRE Curriculum, workshop opportunities and session set up and organisation.



XLR8 takes advantage of its position within NSFA and Northern Tigers FC to directly implement the coaching principles, methodologies and curriculum to provide quality programs to players within development squads. A key aim of XLR8 is to provide quality programs to improve the individual player and create better competitions as a result. Hornsby Heights FC, Chatswood Rangers FC and Turramurra United FC were the main beneficiaries during the season with nine youth teams reaching the semi-finals, as well as high player engagement and development outcomes for MiniRoos development squads.

Team coaching, Football School and our Goalkeeper Academy continued to grow in strength and engagement with clubs delivering programs in house such as Prouille FC, Greenwich SC, Corpus Christi FC, North Turramurra FC and Asquith SC. Providing access to quality programs has been XLR8's purpose during the 2019 season by providing appropriate development opportunities to players throughout the association and inspired by our coaching team of 66 caring and knowledgeable coaches.



XLR8 resumed its presence and local offerings of association wide programs, with Women's Skill Training, Tiger Cubs and Small Group Coaching participation numbers increasing to record attendances. The XLR8 Holiday Clinics maintained the success from 2018 with extremely high numbers across four locations to offer all NSFA members access to local programs in a caring, inspiring and engaging environment.

XLR8 is a key strategic component of the NSFA ecosystem, offering player and coach development opportunities to the wider community whilst ensuring all funds are reinvested back into NSFA initiatives, programs and opportunities for its members.

FEMALE FOOTBALL REPORT

In 2019 NSFA established the Female Football Working Group (FFWG) to engage with the champions on the ground. Over 15 representatives from 13 NSFA clubs are involved and meet regularly throughout the year. The purpose of the FFWG is to gather like-minded individuals from within the NSFA football landscape together in order to collaborate and develop ideas and strategies to strengthen the growth and development of female football.

In its first year the FFWG has positively impacted the NSFA and made a significant contribution that led to NSFA's biggest female football week to date.

Female Football Week (27 May to 2 June 2019)

In 2019 FNSW moved the dates of Female Football Week later in the season to use the initiative as a celebration retention tool rather than an attraction tool - And celebrate NSFA did!

We had events that catered for U6 players to Over 35 players as well as coaches. It was a fantastic week both on the ground as well as on our digital platforms with a range of inspiring content being shared.

A few highlights of the week:

- 140 players attending XLR8 skills clinic at Female Football Friday
- XLR8 Skills Clinic being coached by female coaches
- NSFA community players and Northern Tigers GSAP players chanting and supporting Northern Tigers First Grade Women
- 46 players attending XLR8 Women's Skill Training session
- 25 passionate coaches braving the cold temperatures to attend a Coach Education Workshop
- NSFA teams training with Northern Tigers GSAP
- NSFA Diamond League teams playing Northern Tigers GSAP at Female Football Friday
- The numerous inspiring FFW profiles from champions in NSFA

Future is bright!

FFWG members are passionate and committed to transforming the female game within NSFA. They have set an inspiring goal that by 2023, 32% of NSFA player numbers will be female. They recognise retention by improving the player experience is the key to achieving this.



Strategies that will assist us achieve our ambitions:

- Rebranding U8 to U11 Girls Sunday morning football as Sapphires allowing us to work together to ensure the player's experience is enjoyable and engaging
- Reintroducing licensing format for Diamond League helping NSFA work with clubs to have a long-term strategy
- Continue investing in Female Coach Mentoring Program
- Establish Female Football Coordinators on NSFA club committees
- Encourage clubs to have CCC's whose priority is the female side of the game

The FFWG and NSFA are committed to prioritising the female game to ensure we transform the girls experience. Exciting times ahead!

NORTHERN TIGERS REPORT



On and off the field, 2019 can easily be described as the Northern Tigers most successful ever season. Whilst on-field performances are relatively easy to quantify, the cultural gains made throughout the season had to be experienced to be truly appreciated.

Perhaps the cultural highlight of the year was the emergence of an active supporter zone that has been critical to the development of our club. The "Tigers Kop" embraced all players and supporters and culminated with a deafening performance at the Women's NPL 1 Grand Final against Sydney University at Valentine Sports Park. The Kop is a symbol of the unity and togetherness of the Northern Tigers programs and proudly contained members of our Girls and Boys SAP programs, Girls and Boys Youth teams and senior men's and women's players.



The Kop had plenty to like in 2019. Of our twelve NPL competition teams, eight made finals and three qualified for Grand Finals. Our girls and women's programs - in only their third year in the highest tier of football in NSW - finished in second place on the Club Championship. A remarkable achievement but one that the club is still not satisfied with. Sydney University remain the benchmark outfit in Women's football and we must continue to strive to close the gap.

Our First Grade Women, led by Servet Uzunlar, lost to Sydney University in the Grand Final on penalties and are very motivated to go one better in 2020. As unexciting as it may sound, the secret to closing the gap in 2020 is all about stability and continuity. Over 90% of our first-grade squad have been retained and the powerhouse coaching combination of Jason Eagar and Pat O'Sullivan will once again mentor the group. High retention rates always speak volumes about a club's cul-

ture and are the exception rather than the norm in the FNSW landscape.

Our female Under 14's, Under 17's and Reserve Grade teams also qualified for NPL 1 finals. The Under 17's made it all the way to the Grand Final where they were desperately unlucky not to force the game into extra time. Our focus on youth development paid off throughout the year with numerous Under 17 players ably filling in for an injury depleted reserve grade team.



Not to be outdone, our Men also finished 2nd on the NPL 2 Club Championship ladder. The hallmark of our senior men's teams is consistency with all three squads (Under 18's, Under 20's & First Grade) again comfortably qualifying for finals action.

Adam Hett, a former Tigers First Grade player himself, took over the head coaching reins this season and did a remarkable job. Whilst performing at a consistently high level has been a hallmark of the Tigers Men's program, everyone involved is still committed to promotion to NPL 1. Once again, the quality of our youth programs is producing players of class who will be able to make a significant contribution to senior football very quickly.



Our Under 20's outfit, coached by the effervescent Richie Byrne, prevailed in a thrilling grand final against the might of a Western Sydney Wanderers academy team. An extra time goal from Karim Moursi capped off a brilliant game with a well-deserved victory. Congratulations to all players involved in the

Under 20's campaign. The grand final was a test of character, and the Tigers Trademarks and supporter energy showed once again how hard it is to beat a unified group.

A special mention also to Raphael Blanchon and the Under 16's squad; who had an incredible run all the way to a preliminary final. This team was chock full of talent and it would not be surprising to see players such as Sam Parry and Kealey Adamson making their first-grade debuts before too long.



Congratulations also to Under 13's player Charlie Rengasamy and Under 15's goalkeeper Bodie Denton who were both selected for NSW State Teams in 2019. A remarkable achievement and due recognition for all of their hard work and passion for the game.



2020 promises so much and the planning and trialling is already well under way.
